

Donations are welcome. All checks should be made payable to the Southern Fandom Confederation. The Bulletin is also available for trades, published contributions, and letters of comment.

Permission is granted to reprint all articles, lists, and flyers so long as the author and the *Bulletin* are credited. All art is copyrighted by the artist, unless otherwise specified. An exception is granted in the case of art that appears in a convention flyer.

The editor encourages submission of lengthy written material and art – covers and illos. Contributions and LoCs via electronic means are highly desirable. If you wish to use the Internet, you may send the article as electronic mail or an attachment. If you wish to send the editor computer media, IBM compatible file formats are acceptable. #### SFC BANK ACCOUNT

Randy Cleary (President) filed for and received (12-05-2023) an Employer Identification Number (EIN) for the **Southern Fandom Confederation** as a non-profit organization from the IRS as required to open a bank account anywhere. The proper IRS forms must be filed annually to maintain the EIN.

Brandy Hedren (Treasurer) filed for and received (1-31-2024) a Charter for **Southern Fandom Confederation** in the State of Tennessee as *Nonprofit Corporation – Domestic* as required to get a bank account in Tennessee.

The **Southern Fandom Conderation** now has an active bank account with the Tennessee Valley Federal Credit Union with Brandy Hendren (Treasurer) as the primary account holder. Randy Cleary (President) also is named on the account.

#### DEEPSOUTHCON.ORG DOMAIN

The DeepSouthCon domain name, DeepSouthCon.org, was held for years by an unknown person and has had out-of-date DSC information for several years now. That unknown person is now known. They recently came foreward to offer the domain name to the **Southern Fandom Confederation**. The Officers have agreed to take over the domain name registration costs (\$14.99 per year) and will update the web page when possible. In the mean time, it will redirect to the SFC home page which has the latest DSC information.

#### 1980 MIDSOUTHCON PROGRAM BOOK

The 1980 MidSouthCon held in Huntsville, Alabama was considered "MidSouthCon 1" for the purposes of the numbering sequence used by the ongoing MidSouthCon in Memphis, Tennessee. This was not a North Alabama Science Fiction Association (NASFA) convention, but it led directly to the formation of NASFA. Recently, Sam Smith was gifted with a copy of the 1980 MidSouthCon program book. He has taken the liberty of scanning and OCRing it to a PDF file, located here:

#### **PASSINGS**

Frank Schiavo informs us about Mrs. Fanny Louise Rains, 80, of Purvis, MS who died on November 28th, 2023. "Friends, Family, and Fen...at this time I have the sad duty to pass on to all of you the news of the loss of a member of our CoastCon extended family. Friend, Fan, and long-time convention/club volunteer Louise Rains passed away earlier this week after a long illness. Louise was one of those people who made conventions work and was the living embodiment of the ideal of "Con Mom"- that strong matriarch right there behind the scenes with a sturdy hand, a kind word, and a loving smile whenever/where ever it was needed. Louise always focused on making everything she worked on seem like a family function, either getting right into the action herself or being the one to hold the tools, the children, and/or the beverages, so that others could get the job done. She never thought any job was too small or any Fan undeserving of aid. She always gave the love and support and could be counted on to work hard, keep her cool no matter what, and never be without a positive/kind thing to say, no matter the work or the hours. Like any Con Mom, she could give tough love when you deserved it, be a shoulder when you needed it, a boundless bundle of energy when the work required it, and (most importantly) have your back when the outside world came for you. Funny, bawdy, brash, and fearless in the way that only a true Southern Lady can be, she was also a loving, devoted mother and grandmother to any of us who knew her- no matter by blood or by choice. She never let anything in life hold her or those she loved back- and she worked to share that ideal with everyone she thought of as her family. She was a gifted, wonderful, beautiful soul- inside and out. Like any true Mom she always knew how to make other people feel just as beautiful- and always, always loved. She was the Con Mom we all hoped we could have, and she leaves a legacy of strength, resiliency, and love in our community that is inspiring. She will be greatly missed. "

**David Drake,** 78, of the Silk Hope Community in Pittsboro, NC died on December 10<sup>th</sup>, 2023. He was a Master SF and Fantasy author or co-author of over 80 books and frequent guest at southern conventions, such as LibertyCon, From Libertycon on Facebook..."It is with great sadness that we have heard that LibertyCon 15's Literary Guest of Honor, David Drake, peacefully passed away today. LibertyCon was lucky to have David spend the summers with us for many years, adding his unique blend of brilliance, wit and kindness to the convention. David was a man of many talents and was best known for his military science fiction even though that was only a portion of his published works. He has written humor, thrillers, epic fantasies, space opera, sword & sorceries as well as both historical fantasy and science fiction. David's talent as a writer was only surpassed by his excellence as a human

being. Our hearts go out to David's family and friends as we all grieve together for the passing of this wonderful man."

Memphis Comic and Fantasy Convention on Facebook informs us about the passing of Robert Walker of West Memphis, Arkansas the night of December 25th, 2023..."Today, we lost the best of us. Robert Walker, better known as The Amazing Mr. Robert, passed away this morning. There are people in this world who will come into your life and change it for the better. Mr Robert made you feel like family. He touched so many lives, brought out the best in those that others would discard, and inspired all of us to do the same. He could bring out the kid in anyone, whether it be through his outreach, his antiquities shop (The Daycare Kids?, Comics, Toys, and Antiquities), or just taking the time to talk. There was just a way about Mr. Robert, how he would light up when he'd have a story for you. And that story would usually end with something he'd either find, or have walk into the store. Our hearts go out to his family, both blood and chosen, of which we have been blessed to be a part. He will be missed."

**Terry Ballantine Bisson**, born February 12, 1942, passed on January 10<sup>th</sup>, 2024, was an southern science fiction and fantasy author. He was best known for his short stories, including *Bears Discover Fire*, which won the Hugo Award and the Nebula Award, and *They're Made Out of Meat*.

Southern convention photographer and fan, **Raymond Jones**, age 76, of Nashville, Tennessee passed away on Monday, January 8<sup>th</sup>, 2024. He was born to the late, Ben and Dorothy Jones on 19, 1947 in Nashville, Tennessee.

Nashville fan **Reece Joe Bob Morehead** died at 6:25am, January 23<sup>rd</sup>, 2024 in Southern Hills Hospital, Nashville, after a 14 year battle with prostate cancer. He was a former reference librarian at the Nashville Public Librarian. As per his wishes, he will be cremated. No memorial is planned. Two of his elderly cats spontaneously died last week, wrote his cousin Belinda Lee Leslie, who added, "I am definitely taking a small portion of his ashes to be dusted at some science fiction convention this year."

Sydney Davis LeJeune passed away at Carpenter House, January 24th, 2024. She was born on January 31, 1952. Sydney was the Captain of a Starfleet group in the LA SCFI Club. Frank Schiavo writes..."I have the sad duty to pass on the news of the loss of long-time Southern Louisiana Fan, convention organizer, and group/convention volunteer Sydney LeJeune. She was active in conventions, groups and Fan clubs across the region from the Baton Rouge area all thru Mississippi and beyond. Sydney served in various positions and departments on staff for conventions and events such as BabelCon, Crescent City Con, CoastCon, the Babel Banquet, LaSciFi, and many others. She was a self motivated and tireless volunteer and as a Con manager she was known to be tough but fair. She was a huge Star Trek Fan, but her interests extended across a broad range of Fan pursuits which helped make her a conversation magnet at room parties and in panels. She had a great sense of humor and could always be counted on to make time for her friends at events- always friendly and cordial. Sydney was also a beloved wife, mother, and grandmother who deeply loved her family. We at CONtraflow offer our condolences to her family and many friends at this time."

Southern fan favorite, **Michael Nathan Langford**, age 69, of Collins, died Tuesday, March 5<sup>th</sup>, 2024, at The Oaks Bethany in Vidalia. He was a native of Decatur, Georgia, and had lived the last few years of his life in Collins, Georgia. He was an entertainer and cabaret host for WHOlanta, and also worked as a writer and actor for the *Atlanta Radio Theater Company* and *Sketchworks Comedy*. He was an avid chess player and enjoyed attending and performing at Dragon Con.

Frank Schiavo wrote of the passing of Timothy "Tim" Latham. CoastCon Friends, Family, and Fen...at this time I have the very sad duty to pass on to all of you the news of the loss of one of our own CoastCon extended family- convention staff and volunteer, former dealer, gamer, and long-time regional Fan Timothy "Tim" Latham, who passed first weekend of May of 2024. Tim was a much beloved member of Fandom in our area, especially in the Southern Mississippi Fandom community. At one time he was a fixture on the local convention scene, sharing his work, advice, and time among local Fans across the South doing considerable work in our region supporting events as a program participant, gamer, charity volunteer, dealer, and staff member. You could always find him at conventions, Renfairs, and geek-themed events all across the South, usually cutting up/visiting, or at a game table with friends. Tim was a passionate, fiercely talented, thoughtful, and supportive person to seasoned pros and new fans alike. You always looked forward to seeing him and there are folks in our community who are still Fans to this day because of the effort, kindness, and wisdom Tim often offered or friendly ear he could always be counted on to give in times of stress. He was meditative, brilliant, clever, and quick with his wit and wisdom- but never cruel or thoughtless. He was as passionate as they came about his interests- model trains, good coffee, gaming, cats, and family (born & made)- not ashamed or shy about sharing his views about the things he loved-and didn't love. He thanklessly worked very hard at everything he did. When his health declined in recent years, he still made time for his friends, hobbies, and loved ones online and in person when he could. On that last part, I can personally attest to how Tim was indeed a loving and loyal friend who would always try to find you at conventions or online- just to catch up, make sure you are doing well, and/or just pass a few good moments in shared joy on some crazy memories or today's silly dad-pun. He will be very deeply missed by all of us who were lucky enough to know him.

Frank Schiavo wrote the following about the passing of **Sheila Strickland**. "...I have the very sad duty to pass on to all of you the news of the loss of a member of our CONtraflow family-convention staff, volunteer, and long-time Fan, Sheila Strickand, who passed away May 9. Sheila was a much beloved and respected member of the regional Fan community

at shows and events all across the Gulf South. From her work with BRSFL in Baton Rouge, to her staff time with CoastCon, Crescent City Con, and CONtraflow, to her work with the Southern Fandom Press Alliance, to her volunteer stints at World Cons, World Fantasy Cons, and NASFIC'S she was the kind of staff member always working tirelessly to make sure events went on schedule and went well. She was hard-working and brilliant, a problem solver of the highest order, and more than capable of doing any convention job there was to do- as she proved often in the many years of her volunteer time across Gulf South Fandom. No matter if that job required hours behind a registration desk, longer hours putting program books together, or the weeks/months it took to work with all the moving parts in organizing volunteers. She got it done with as little drama as possible. She also nurtured young staff/Fans encouraging them to the same standards of excellence she held/embodied- always with a friendly face, professional efficiency, and a seemingly never flappable demeanor- no matter the challenge. In her non-convention time she was an important part of the team at the East Baton Rouge Public Library, where she was also known for her friendly but professional skills. All of that is not to say she was all hard work- she was extremely well read/loved books (and talking about them), wickedly funny, a political firebrand, and a deeply passionate free thinker and believer in intellectual freedoms. Sure, she seemed demure and unassumingly to the outsider, but she didn't suffer foolishness (and fools) lightly. Sheila was also a devoted family member, church goer, pet-parent, and mentor as well a compassionate, fiercely loving friend to everyone lucky enough to be in her orbit. She more than likely would be bothered by any fuss on the topic, but her life was one truly lived and should truly be celebrated. She will be deeply and profoundly missed."
